

Christ places Christians in the world at just the right place and time to serve his purpose and glorify him

"For Such a Time as This"

"The only good way to serve God is to be a pastor or a teacher."

That's what much of the visible church was teaching in Martin Luther's day. The priestly class taught that the only works God truly loved were the kinds done by monks in monasteries and priests in cathedrals.

The Bible led Luther to a far different conclusion. For people who wondered how they should serve God, he rightly wrote, "Consider *your place in life* according to the Ten Commandments." Are you a husband? Love your wife. Are you an employee? Serve your employer honestly. Are you a child? Honor your parents. Serve God where he's placed you—he didn't mess up by putting you where you are!

Over 450 years before the Christ was born, a Jewish woman named Ezra learned that truth. She had been chosen to be the queen of King Xerxes, the ruler of Persia. But then a member of the royal court hatched a plan to destroy the Jews. Not only would that genocide be a terrible crime in itself; it also would have wiped out the line of the coming Savior.

When Esther's cousin discovered the plot, he urged Esther to speak to King Xerxes on the Jews' behalf. To go into the king's presence uninvited, though, meant risking death—even if you were the queen.

What gave Esther the courage to speak? Her cousin urged her: "Who know but that you have come to royal position for such a time as this?" It was his way of saying, Esther, you know God's will and the love we're to show to each other. Look at where God has placed you now. Don't miss this opportunity to serve him.

What was true for Esther is true for us as individuals and as a congregation. Are you a father or mother, son or daughter, employer or employee, friend or neighbor? God has not messed up by placing you where you are. You have abilities and opportunities to serve him.

What opportunities has God placed in front of us as a congregation? God doesn't *need* us to carry them out—if Esther wouldn't have acted, the Lord would have raised up another deliverer—but he gives us the opportunity to serve him. If we let fear or concern for ourselves stop



us from serving him, he will give those chances to others.

We're united in love and thanks to God for the salvation he's given us in Christ Jesus. What's the best way to serve him? As individuals and a church, *consider your place in life*. How will God use me—me!—to do his will? Thank the Lord for bringing us to where we are for such a time as this!



The Christian Church has a long and wonderful history of a richly musical worship style. King David was a master musician himself. The Psalms encourage us to praise God with a wide range of instruments: harp, cymbals, trumpets, tambourines, flutes, and stringed instruments are all listed by name.


If you've paid attention to the news over the last few years, you may have noticed that this unity is a rare thing in church bodies these days. How is that unity preserved in a church body made up of nearly 1,500 churches?

One part of that answer is the role our District Presidents play. Our church body is made up of 12 geographic districts. Each district elects

a pastor to serve as its District President. In addition to assisting with Calls and synod administration, the Presidents are also responsible for doctrinal unity. They seek to correct pastors or

teachers who stray from the clear message of God's Word.

Continue to thank the Lord for the role these men play, and the unity we have in the truths of Scripture!



Childcare Committee Update

For the last few years, *Shining Mountains* has given focused consideration to how we might better carry out Christ's Great Commission to *go and make disciples of all nations*. Recently, much of that discussion had centered around a child-care concept.

That work is continuing to progress, with some slight changes in direction. The Committee's discussions now focus around the possibilities of building a new church with a 3k-4k preschool with wrap-around daycare. Initial investigations and discussions with architects and builders seem to indicate that building a new facility may be even more cost-effective than buying an existing church, and would give more flexibility to our ministry and opportunities for later expansion. As the Committee assembles plans and seeks information from other WELS preschool directors, it seems that such an endeavor would be self-supporting. However, more research will continue over the next few months.

What can you do? Continue to pray that our church would have increased opportunities to share the Word of Life with people who don't know it. Encourage the Committee as they work faithfully on this project on our behalf. And stay informed: attend Voters' meetings and watch for information in the newsletter and bulletins.

MISSION NEWS:

Taking the Word to the World



The work in Hong Kong, Taiwan, and the People's Republic of China continues at a breathtaking pace.

Close to 60 ESL teachers, many of them graduates of Martin Luther College, are teaching English by day in China's schools and witnessing their faith in off hours. With conversions and baptisms taking place, small groups are regularly gathering around the Word.

Seminary graduates have been placed in the country for the past three years to learn the Chinese language and mentor the teachers as they nourish small groups.

Asia Lutheran Seminary in Hong Kong had its first graduation last November. The five graduates included some new pastors and some already in the ministry studying for advanced degrees.

A *Translation Working Group* is involved in an ambitious program to translate key Lutheran materials and books into the Chinese language and in transferable form to reach the vast numbers that thirst for spiritual nurture.

What can you do to support this ministry?

- Support it with your offerings. The monies you designate as mission offerings each Sunday go directly to such projects
- Pray to the Lord of the church that he would keep these new-born Christians (and the missionaries who care for them) safe from spiritual and physical danger
