Bound to the Word

These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates. (Deuteronomy 6:6-9)

God spoke those words to the Israelites through his servant Moses. And the Israelites did something interesting: they did exactly what God told them to—literally! Over the years, many Israelites began to put small sections of Scripture in little boxes—called phylacteries—that they would "tie on their hands" and "bind on their foreheads." They were literally bound to God's Word.

Of course, God was calling on them to do something far different than that. He was telling them to be "bound" to God's Word in a different way. He wanted *his* Word of Life to be a constant part of *their* lives. He didn't just want his Word to be *near* them, but *in* them. That's still part of God's will for us today, too. God promises us that true peace, joy, contentment and hope are gifts that he gives to us in his Word. And he wants his children to have and enjoy those gifts!

How will that be true for you? Bear in mind God's Word to the Israelites but avoid the mistake of just "outward worship." Make it your goal for God's Word to be "upon your heart." Talk about it with your family. Resist the urge to have the TV on immediately after (or even during!) a meal. Carve out time to read a few minutes of Scripture, and talk about what it means with your family. Don't tie Bible passages to your hands or forehead., but let the deeds of your hands and the thoughts of your mind reflect what God says in the Bible.

There are plenty of other ways as well. If you haven't been to a Bible class for a while, make now the time you start again. Talk about God's Word with your fellow believers. Bring your children (or friends or neighbors) to Sunday School. Let your goal be to ever grow in your understanding of God's love and will for you.



It's easy for us to fall into a religious life that's all about what's on the outside—the number of times we come to church or the way we talk. These things are important, but God's will for us starts with what happens on the inside, as we grow in faith and take his Word to heart. May God bless you as you grow in his truths!

On October 2-3, a representative from "Builders for Christ" (BFC) will be in Bozeman. BFC is a division of WELS Kingdom Workers, a group that works in cooperation with our church body's Board of Home Missions.

BFC's goal is to assist mission churches build new facilities at a reduced cost. The group has a membership of over 350 volunteer men and women from 17 states. These volunteers—most of whom have extensive experience in construction—travel across the country to help build churches and parsonages. Since it is a volunteer group, their involvement tends to eliminate most labor costs from a building project.

As Shining Mountains continues to look for ways to advance our ministry, BFC agreed to travel here and meet with our congregation at no charge to us. A representative will meet with the leadership of our church on Saturday, Oct. 2, and with the entire congregation on Sunday, Oct. 3. The goals of the meeting are to establish whether or not BFC would be able to work with us on a new facility, and how much such cooperation could reduce our costs and make a new facility feasible. The meeting in no way obligates SMLC to work with BFC.

BFC does not charge for its work. The organization is made up of men and women who choose to give of their time and abilities to assist churches as they share the gospel. Volunteers tend to stay in their own RVs or campers near the project site. The host congregation generally provides one meal a day for the workers and often helps out with site clean-up at the end of each day.

May God use this meeting to open more doors for our ministry to grow, reminds us of the great blessings that God gives through our Synod, and lead us to give him thanks for our brothers and sisters in faith who give so freely of their abilities to further his Kingdom!



In-Home Small Group Studies

A chance to grow in God's Word and with your fellow Christians

In September Shining Mountains will be restarting its small group in-home Bible studies. These studies—held in members

homes and led either by Pastor or by a trained member—give us a chance to meet in smaller groups to discuss God's Word and the way it applies to our lives. It also gives us a chance to get to know each other in a different setting than Sunday morning worship and Bible study.

Since our members live across the Gallatin valley and have different schedules, having

multiples classes provides opportunity for as many of us as possible to become involved. This year we aim to have three locations—one each in Bozeman, Bel-



grade, and Manhattan. The study groups meet once a month on the day and time that works best with the schedules of the

people in that particular group.

This year's study begins with a look at the book, "What in the World Is Going On?" published by our Northwestern Publishing House. Through six chapters, Pastor David Thompson (ELS) leads us through a Scriptural discussion of the differing *worldviews* that exist in our culture. He lays a foundation of understanding the Confessional Lu-

theran worldview, and then discusses the many other worldviews that we are exposed to in modernism, post-modernism and spiritualism. At the heart of the study is the question: "How much does the world we live in affect our faith?"

Participants are encouraged to buy a copy of the book (about \$12) to help them get the most out of each study, but doing so isn't required. (A sign-up sheet for the books will be posted soon so Pastor can order them.) When they meet, groups will discuss the current chapter and study other relevant portions of Scripture.

Locations and sign-up sheets will be posted on the bulletin board and announced in the worship folder soon.

May God bless this chance to grow in our knowledge of his Word and our fellowship with each other.

MISSION NEWS: Taking the Word to the World



In Pakistan 23,000 students are now enrolled in the Bible Correspondence and Teaching courses. Most of these numbers are children being trained in Christian schools of various denominations, although close to 2,000 of these courses are distributed to villages by workers via bicycles. This work, begun in 2006, has now distributed 65,000 pieces of literature.

The requests for our materials have been huge since no other mission agency has provided materials for children that have the Urdu translation and graphic illustration like those provided through WELS Multi-Language Publications.

Our contact in Pakistan and his wife recently finished instruction and have made the decision to switch from Anglican to Lutheran Christians. Their desire is to plant a Lutheran Church in this country.

We are continually uplifted by the courageous witness of the Christian community in Pakistan in the face of heavy Muslim opposition.

As Shining Mountains' Church Council prepares a 2011 budget for voter approval at the end of this year, it's a fitting time to reflect on the work that our mission dollars accomplish around the globe, and give thanks to God for the chance to share in that gospel ministry.

May God bless and keep those Christians in Pakistan until the day when we finally meet them at our Savior's feet in heaven!
