Be Watchful! Be Ready!

What lesson are you going to take from Harold Camping?

If you've been following his story over the last few months, I'm sure you've been torn between laughing and crying. Camping is the host of a Christian radio broadcast who's been very active in predicting the end of the world. He originally set the date for May 21st, 2011; when that day came and went, he revised the date to October 21st.

Dozens of Camping's followers quit their jobs to spend the last few months spreading the promise of the coming Armageddon around the country. Bank accounts were emptied in support of this ministry. Countless comedians and reporters found fodder for jokes.

What about you? What lessons should a Christian take from this?

There's something to be admired in the zeal of those Camping deceived. Jesus tells us the End *is* real; there is a day coming when he will return and judge the world. (In fact, that's one of the three most-repeated doctrines in all of the Bible!) That *should* change our lives. God says the knowledge of the coming End should move us to be faithful in worship (Hebrews 10:25); to live chaste, Christian lives as we turn from our sins (Luke 3:17); and to

always be watchful and ready ourselves (Matthew 25).

That gives us good reason to ask ourselves: *Am I focused on what I should be?* Do you continue to live untroubled by your sin, instead of turning away from it? Do you treat time in God's Word as unimportant? God calls us to turn from that behavior.

These last few months remind us of another truth: Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world (1 John 4:1). There is no end of people willing to stand up and proclaim "what God says." Who's able to tell the difference between what's true and what's a lie? You are! Go back to Scripture and compare what they say with God's Word. (For instance, Jesus says clearly in Matthew 24:36 that no one will be able to predict when the end of the world will come.)

In November and December, we celebrate two unique seasons of the Church Year: End Times and Advent. In their own ways, both of those seasons focus on Jesus' return. The emphasis in both is preparing ourselves to meet our Savior—at his coming at the end of the



world and his coming as a baby in Bethlehem.

God grant that your time in God's house during these seasons is a meaningful way to focus past the issues of daily life, and find a focus on the glories of heaven that will never pass away.

A monthly Bible Study at Shining Mountains

Last month we began a new monthly Bible study that walks through the first five books of the Bible in just eight sessions. By the end of study, participants will have a better knowledge of some of the key figures in Bible history, see God's grace in promising a Savior from the beginning of the world, and understand key Biblical concepts from a new perspective.

It's not to late to join! Our next study will be held from 6:45-8:00 on Thursday, Nov. 17th. We'll review some basic information from the flood and the life of Abraham and look a bit deeper at two questions:

- Did people really live for hundreds of years in those days? Why?
- Why was polygamy so common in the Old Testament? Was this allowed by God?

To get the most out of our study, consider reading Genesis 5-25 before we meet. Childcare will be provided on request.

For most of us, December is a time to get ready for the busyness of Christmas—the shopping, cooking, cleaning and wrapping that all need to be done in advance of the *big day*.

Advent is a reminder that there's something more important to be concerned about. During the four weeks of Advent, we focus on what it truly means to be prepared for Christ's coming, so we focus on his coming to us through his Word, his coming in the flesh at Bethlehem, and his coming again in glory at the end of all time.

To help celebrate that time together, the members and friends of *Shining Mountains* are invited to an Advent Party after church on Sunday, December 4th. We'll share a meal, work together to decorate our church home for our Christmas worship, and take part in a gift exchange. Bring along your children—there will be activities for them to take part in, too.

As we continue to pursue a new ministry home, a number of key steps have been taken, or are just around the corner:

Church concept and plan presented

In early October, we presented a concept for what a future church home could be like—the approximate size and space, the amount of seating and classrooms, etc. The concept had been prepared for us by Massmann Studios. While the concept could undergo great revisions once our final site is chosen, it allowed the congregation to get a sense of the size of building we're aiming for.

After church, a plan was presented showing how we had gotten to this point, why a building project is seen to be both important and feasible, and how we might actually accomplish it. If you haven't seen a copy of the document presented there ("A Path Forward"), please ask Pastor Seifert for a copy.

Real estate developments

In the October 2nd meeting, the voters gave the Council the authority to relist our property on Valley Center Rd with a new agent, at a new price, in the hopes of realizing a sale.

In the Oct. 16th meeting, the voters authorized the Council to place a contingency offer on the property on the corner of Baxter and Davis.

Both of the actions listed above were executed on October 25th.

A special voters' meeting has been called for Sunday, Oct. 30 to discuss moving to a housing allowance system and listing the parsonage for sale. The move is expected to allow us to pay off our CEF loan, raise the amount of our Building Fund, and reduce our annual operating budget.

May our good and gracious Savior bless these steps forward, to the growth of His Kingdom!



November Book Order


Advent is a time of focus, preparation and repentance as we consider Christ's coming at Christmas. It can be an especially meaningful time to begin family or personal devotions.
