I believe in

+ the Holy Christian Church +

In the Third Article of the Apostles' Creed, we confess our faith in "the Holy Christian Church." Throughout our newsletters in 2012, we'll examine what this means. What is the Church? What is the difference between "the Church" and "churches"? What does it matter what church you belong to? What's going on among "Lutheran" churches? God's Word will guide our discussion as we talk about these questions.

What comes to your mind when you think of what it means to be "WELS"?

Shining Mountains is a member of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod. That brings up different thoughts for any number of people. What does it bring to your mind? The pastor who baptized you and your children? The style of worship that you took part in every week for decades of your life? The church that reached out to you when you were lost and searching? The family that was there for you when you buried someone you loved? Lord-willing, many of those things might come to your mind!

And sadly, a few others might, too. Perhaps you think of a congregation that didn't always function the way you wanted it

to. A pastor who showed no tact or love when handling a difficult family situation, or taught something that didn't square with biblical truth. A church that didn't welcome the friend that you brought along to worship. Christians who didn't seem to have zeal to reach out to the lost.

What comes to your mind when you think of the WELS? Perhaps *both* of those paragraphs have some truth for you. Because we're a church body filled with sinful human beings who believe in Christ, there will be ways that we put Christ's love into wonderful actionand times that we fail in the worst of ways.

By being WELS, we are neither denying those sins nor pretending we have only successes. Instead, we're making a confession about what it is we believe.

Scripture alone + Christ Alone + Grace Alone

A foundational part of our confession is that we look to the Bible alone for truth. It's worth mentioning something: virtually every church body says that. So what do we mean?

It means that we believe the Bible has no errors and has complete authority in matters of faith and life. If God's Word says something that science or reason seems to contradict (such as Jesus' resurrection), we hold to the Word. If the thinking of our age or of mankind doesn't like what the Bible says, we still hold to the Word.

At the heart of that Word is the message that Jesus Christ, God's perfect Son, became man and offered his life as the atoning sacrifice for all of our sins. When we hold to the Word of God, we're holding to God's message of salvation by his grace

Yet we hold to it as sinful people. This confession doesn't mean that pastors and church leaders never make mistakes even doctrinal ones. At times, pastors and other leaders even need to be removed from office because of sinful false teaching or scandalous living. A congregations can lose their focus on that message and become lazy in their Christian life (the Bible is full of examples of this happening to God's people). That doesn't mean that our confession is wrong; it means we're not paying attention to it and need to remember where our true life

is found.

The Lutheran Confessions

As a church body, we've confessed full agreement with the doctrines found in the Lutheran Confessions (Luther's catechisms, the Augsburg Confession and its Apology, the Smalcald Articles, etc.). We confess them to be a faithful confession of what Scripture teaches—and what it rejects as false. These documents are helpful in explaining clearly to others what the Bible says. They're also a tool for holding our own ministers and churches accountable to the Word.



While our church body will always be filled with sinners, our doctrinal confession is true and in line with the Word of God. Will it always be so?

It would be foolish to simply say yes. Over time, countless churches and Christians have wandered from the faithchurches in Germany, the home of the Reformation, are almost entirely empty! We can't say what will happen in years to come, nor do we have a need to. Rather, we're to ask ourselves every day: Am I holding to God's Word? God grant that when we do so, he blesses us with churches, ministers and people that are alive with the Gospel, so that when we think of what it means to be WELS, our first thought is simply of a Lord who saves us by his grace alone.

Building project update: LAND SEARCH

The next major step towards a new church home that the Council's been working on is the search for a suitable site. Ideally, that site will be located close to many of our members, in an area with good visibility and accessibility, provide us with room to build and conduct ministry—and fit within our budget goals.

There are two parcels of land that seem likely to fit those criteria. As the Council gets closer to bringing a recommendation to the congregation, it may be beneficial for you to visit the properties. They are:

- Davis Rd, just north of Baxter: This piece has been on the congregation's radar for the better part of a year. It's fairly centrally located and has excellent visibility. It's close to a number of new subdivisions and Chief Joseph Middle School. A number of retail and office developments are being planned for the area. It seems like the area will be experiencing growth for years, and there is currently no church in the immediate area. However, the subdivision process for this land is a bit more complicated than most, and we'd not be able to begin building until late 2013 / early 2014.
- The southwest corner of Babcock and Ferguson: This parcel recently became available to us. Just one block north of Huffine and a few lots north of The Ridge athletic center, it also has high visibility and is surrounded by a great deal of residential development. While most of the area around this land is already developed, there will still be continued growth along Huffine to the west. Our Manhattan / Belgrade / Toston members will find that if they come south on Jackrabbit from Belgrade, it's virtually the same distance as our current church building.

The Council is continuing to get the details of each property before bringing recommendations before the congregation. That includes getting as accurate an idea as possible of the costs to engineer and prepare each site, and using Letters of Intent with the owners to better understand what type of offer would be acceptable. While we don't yet have a timeframe, steps are taken to get us closer each week.

What can you do? Prayer is certainly appreciated. Ask the Lord to bless our efforts and give us wisdom as we move forward. Visit the properties to see them for yourself; if you know of any other parcels we should be investigating, relay them to Pastor or the Council. And strive for growth in your stewardship and offerings; the stronger our finances are as a congregation, the more confidently we'll be able to step into this new phase in our mission of sharing the Gospel.
